HOLY ROLLERS, HIGH ROLLERS

Over three years ago, the Shepherd's Trust fundraiser netted about \$511,000 for retired Antigonish clergy.

Now parishioners face the prospect of raising more than 25 times the amount, for its \$13 million abuse settlement. As a pre-scandal Bishop Lahey acknowledged to the Casket in August, "Obviously there are going to be very heavy financial burdens upon every parish."

Many of the nearly 130,000 Antigonish Catholics believe Rome should step up to the collection plate. In a related newsflash, someday hell may freeze over.

But no doubt more than one camel has squeezed through the eye of a needle, when Antigonish priests line up at the pearly gates.

Dating back to 2003, I see where the net worth of 15 probated estates of Antigonish curates combine for over \$4.6 million.

The largest belonged to Father Donald Belland, who was worth a heavenly \$1.2 million when he died at 78 on Feb. 3, 2007. While Don's brother Ray Belland was the chief benéficiary, the Diocese and St. FX made off with \$5,000 apiece.

North Sydney native Father Hector MacDonald, who at 79 died 10 days after Father Don, left the Antigonish Catholic Episcopal Corp. a more sizeable donation, bequeathing the Diocese over half his \$206,000 estate. (Father Hector also earmarked \$14,000 to various parishes and charities.)

Father Daniel Alphonsus Doyle, 89, gave former Bishop Lahey \$20,000 from his \$320,000 estate, and directed \$50,000 to the priests pension fund and \$1,000 to the Chancery office (Frank 462). Father Phonse, who died March 5, 2005, did not stipulate any gift to the Diocese per se.

Five additional Fathers amassed estates over \$250,000. Longtime St. FX education prof Murdock MacLean, 88, was worth \$564,135 at his Aug. 19, 2008 death; St. FX English faculty member Vincent MacLellan, who died June 24, 2009, was worth \$429,932; former Bishop William Power, 88; boasted a \$418,333 estate after his November 2003 death; West Louisbourg priest and St. FX prof Gerald Power, 82, who died Jan. 27, 2008, was worth \$278,505; and Second World War veteran William DeCourcy, 82,
