Discipline Policemen In Mishaps

Ottawa policemen involved in accidents are being severely disciplined for negligence, Mayor Whitton has told Board of Control.

Records show the Police Department has been involved in 36 accidents in the past 12 months, compared with only seven for the Fire Department. The cost to the city was \$6,000 for police accidents and only \$40 for fire vehicle mishaps.

It was suggested a Board of Control that policemen involved in accidents were escaping "scot free," but Mayor Whitton said this wasn't true.

"Actually, policemen who were negligent received disciplinary measures that were three times more severe than those received by other civic department workers involved in accidents," she said.
