Father Basil Regan, C.S.B., Principal and an Old Boy from St. Joseph's Parish, is one of three brothers in the Congregation of St. Basil. His oldest brother, Bernard, is the councillor at Catholic Central High School for Boys in Detroit, and his brother Oscar is the Assistant Superior at Aquinas Institute, Rochester, N.Y. A graduate of the University of Toronto and the Ontario College of Education, Father Regan was an exceptionally successful Latin teacher before he succeeded Father Viator McIntyre as Principal in 1945. As a student, he played on the same Junior OHA team as Father "Jack" Pereyma, now pastor of St. George's Church, Oshawa, and until the last year or two pitched shutout ball for the staff in their annual game with Grade XIII.

Father Donald Faught, C.S.B., Assistant Superior and Head of the Mathematics Department, is an Old Boy of three high schools: North Bay Collegiate, St. Michael's College School, and Assumption College School. His three brothers, John, Basil and Stanley are also Old Boys of St. Michael's. In Arts he is a graduate of St. Michael's College and a medalist in Mathematics. He is a graduate of the Ontario College of Education and obtained his M.A. at the University of Michigan. Father Faught is the Faculty Moderator of the Martha Guild of the new St. Michael's.

Father Matthew Teefy Mulcahy, C.S.B., Assistant Principal and Librarian, is the bearer of names honored in the annals of St. Michael's. Father Michael Mulcahy. C.S.B., was one of the early students of St. Michael's, while a later relative, Father John R. Teefy, C.S.B., was one of its most illustrious Heads. As an Arts student at St. Michael's he lived in the Irish Flat with Father Blake Ryan, now Principal of Cathedral High School in Hamilton. Before becoming a Basilian, he taught in High Schools at Penetang and South Porcupine.

Bachelor and Master of Arts from the University of Toronto, graduate of the Ontario College of Education, he was a Chemistry Teacher before he became involved in the financial side of school life.

Father Frank Boland, C.S.B., Head of the History department, is an Old Boy of St. Vincent de Paul Parish. In high school at St. Michael's he was a classmate of Charles Holtham, Father Matt Darby, Gerry Horgan, and Al Gallagher. He is a graduate in Arts of St. Michael's College, and a graduate of the Ontario College of Education. He obtained his M.A. at the University of Detroit. He has taught at St. Thomas High School, Houston, Texas, and last year at St. Mary's High School, Calgary. At St. Michael's Father Boland has been very successful as coach of minor hockey and football teams.

Father Patrick Gorman, C.S.B., English teacher, is an Old Boy from St. Basil's Parish who was born in Sudbury, Ontario. At St. Michael's, he was a classmate of Father Boniface Hendricks, C.P. Bachelor and Master of Arts from the University of Toronto; holder of both assistant's and specialist's certificates from the Ontario College of Education, he finds time to take an interest in debating, house leagues and minor team athletics.

Father Robert Whyte, C.S.B., Editor of the Religious Bulletin, is an Old Boy from Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish. In 1934 he was chosen to attend Cardinal Villeneuve as one of eight pages who accompanied His Eminence on his visit to Toronto. Among his classmates at St. Michael's were Fathers Robert Clune, William O'Brien, Francis Voorwerk and Edward Mahoney. A graduate of the University of Toronto and of the Ontario College of Education, he is the friend and counsellor of every boy in the Lower School.
