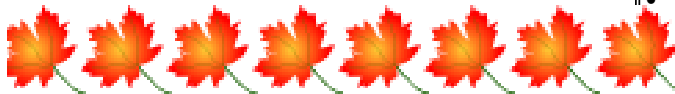

On the weekend of October 19-20, we will celebrate **World Mission Sunday 2013**. On World Mission Sunday, we are called to focus our attention on the needs of the Church in the developing world. Our prayers and financial support are vitally needed by more than 1,150 dioceses throughout Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands, and remote regions of Latin America. At Baptism, each of us is given the responsibility to be missionary – to share our faith and to be active participants in the Church's mission to all peoples.
