

In this reading we are warned by Paul not to presume that we can understand the mystery of God. God is beyond our ability to comprehend.

Jesus questions his close disciples about the rumours surrounding him. "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" Peter then makes his profession of faith and is acknowledged by Jesus as having a unique role in the future Church.

A Church In Conflict

In our gospel today, Jesus points out that the Church will always be in a struggle against the forces of death."...upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." It seems that Jesus was saying that as long as the Church exists there would be forces in the world trying to fight against it. Yes, Jesus promised us that conflict would always be a part of the life of the Church.

There are many kinds of conflict in which the Church must engage if she is to remain faithful to her calling. An extreme example of conflict is seen in those countries where the government is clearly and brutally oppressive and yet where the Church bravely and boldly speaks out on behalf of the oppressed. In these countries, the Church cannot choose to remain silent while injustice and brutality roam freely throughout the land.

As a Church, we must raise our awareness of the needs that exist around the world and in our own community. When we discover a serious human need that is not being met, we have the duty of speaking out on behalf of those who might not have a voice of their own. And often, this means entering into a situation where we need to challenge official policies and procedures as they affect certain groups of people.

If we are used to seeing our faith as a private and personal affair, then all of this will seem strange and out of order. But our faith is not a narrow, self-serving kind of faith. Our Catholic faith is a faith that reaches out in service to those who need caring for. Pope John Paul in "Crossing the Threshold", declared that "The gospel is not a promise of easy success. It does not promise a comfortable life to anyone. It makes demands..."
