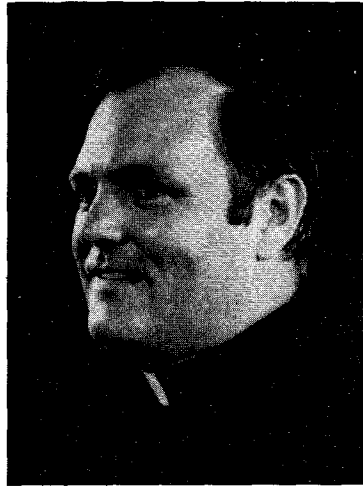
SADIE MacNEIL, SISTER EDNA MacDONALD, MI-
