The Meal Program is now in operation. Thanks to the parents who have volunteered to assist our Lunch Bunch. We are still in need of parents at the end of each month to assist in putting the order together and getting the money to the bank. Should you wish to volunteer please contact Mrs. Nancy MacGillivrary or call Claire at the school and she will forward a message and you will get a call.

#### No Refund Policy

We have asked that all meals be pre paid. Last year we lost hundreds of dollars as we had to return money and had to pay for the meals which were delivered to the school. Once we make an order the food is purchased and we cannot return it. Following a lengthy discussion at our Parent Council Meeting, it was decided we would adopt this no refund policy. Students who do not attend school because they have been suspended cannot arrive at the school expecting to be fed. They are not allowed on school Property. Parents of students who are absent and wish to pick up their meal may do so at the office before we deliver the food to the class. The parent volunteer will get you the meal. Pickup times are 11:35 and 11:55. Our Parent Volunteers are to be commended for efforts. Parents are asked to direct any difficulties to the school through the agenda. You might also direct any positive feedback through the agenda's as well. It has to be remembered we are offering this service as we believe in the value for both our parents and children. If you consider we are serving on average 200 meals a day, this translates into 1000 meals a week. There will be mistakes, but remember we as a team working together can eliminate errors if we all follow the routines we have set out. All profits from this program remain in the school to support the various activities in our school.

**Fundraising** 

This year's fundraising was in part a success; however, not all funds have been received. The money continues to trickle into the school. We need to put closure on this activity so tat we can forward the names to the School Board in order for them to prepare Income Tax Receipts. We had about 20 % participation in this activity. Parents who wish to contribute to the school may do so directly by sending money to school. In June we will send a list if names to the Board for receipts. To all our parents thank you for your efforts now and in the future. More information about the Fundraising will follow.

Remember we have our Parent Council Meetings of the first Wednesday of each month. All parents are welcome to attend.

## Reminders

- · The City of Cornwall has passed a by-law which will improve the traffic problem after school. They have a no stopping zone between Aubin Street and Gallanger Street. I have been informed that the By-law enforcement officer will be reviewing the area. Your cooperation is needed to insure the safety of our children
- A safety concern we have is the practice of dropping off the children in the Bus loading area. We would appreciate it if you would wait until the busses leave the area as children cannot walk between busses. The busses unload at 8:45 AM.
- Please note the school does not start until 9:00 AM. We see more and more children arriving at the school much too early. Some children are around the school at 8:00AM. This is too early as the yard is supervised from 8:45 AM. We will allow children in the school at that time in extremely cold or wet weather. For the walkers they should time their arrival between 8:45 and 9:00AM.
- Please insure your child has the necessary clothing to wear outside.
- Each year we have bags of mittens and clothes which are sent to the Salvation Army or Agape Centre. These clothes are worn to school and then forgotten or misplaced Theyt end up in our lost and found. Should your child come home with an item which is not theirs then someone in the school in missing it. Items which are found are to be brought into the school. Children cannot trade their clothing with one another. We need your help. With the cost of kids clothing I strongly urge you to identify the clothing so as it can be returned. Many time students loose their things and claim they were stolen. Identification might solve this problem.
- This is the season of Christmas but also the season of extra pants as the yard is muddy and in spite of our attempts to keep kids out of the water children will get wet and need a change. You might send extra clothes.
- Reminder of our Dress code policy. Some of the tops in the school are too short and expose the tummy.
- Parents are encouraged to read the information given to them at the Parent Interview. You are also asked to "Make the Call." The more people who call the Ministry of Education the better chance we have of getting the additional funds for Programming. Parents can affect a change.
- If you are shopping at M&M Meats, the school receives a percentage of the purchases you make. Please remember our number is 49, when you get to the cash, or you might tell them you are shopping for Sacred Heart Catholic School. Two times a year we receive a cheque from
