### A Little Bit about Father Hope...

My name is Fr. Hope KLUTSEY. I am from a village in the South Eastern part of the Volta Region of Ghana called Akatsi. I am the 5<sup>th</sup> born of a family of eight; seven males and one female. I was ordained a Roman Catholic priest on August 8, 1998 in Ghana. I am a member of the Society of African Missions (SMA), a missionary congregation.

My first appointment was in Ivory Coast. I worked as a Parochial Vicar for four years. I was then selected to work in Ghana as SMA Vocations Director for two years. At the end of the second year, I was elected the Regional Superior of Ghana for a three-year mandate, which I successfully completed. While on sabbatical year in Dublin Ireland, I profitably pursued Masters Degree course in Moral Theology for two years. I was appointed a Parish Priest of St. Michael's Catholic Church, Chibolya, Mufulira, in Zambia for the past four year. During my tenure as a pastor of St. Michael's, I undertook different interesting projects in the parish. Can I listen to the same story or the same stale jokes, without making the speaker aware of my annoyance by breaking in or cutting him short?

Can I offer words of praise readily?

Do I begrudge the words of praise I hear addressed to others, especially if these words are to the credit of someone I do not particularly like, or if whom I may be somewhat jealous?

Have I formed the habit of offering a ready thank-you for small favors received?

Do I ever make an effort to say encouraging words?

Do I check my impulses to reply to unkind words in a spirit of revenge or to defend myself.

Have I tried to deepen my faith regarding the truth that every act of charity toward a neighbor is also an act of love of God?

Have I refused to give alms for the relief of the needy or to charitable causes, such as the missions, even though I had opportunities and sufficient means without depriving myself or my family of the necessities of life?

Have I measured my charity only by what others gave, or by what I might receive in return, instead of by my ability to give and by the need of others?

Have I faced the truth that I shall take no material wealth with me beyond death, and that the memory and merit of deeds of charity will then be my greatest consolation?

Have I demanded publicity and praise for my almsgiving?

Have I squandered or given away money outside my home to the extent that it left my immediate family in want of necessary things? Have I been remiss in my duty toward the sick who are dependent on me?

Have I cooperated with another in committing a sin?

When I had the opportunity, have I done anything to prevent evil, such as the circulation of obscene books and magazines?

Have I led others, especially children into sin by suggestion or bad example?

Have I permitted another to suffer injustice or mistreatment when my influence could have prevented it?
