Meditations on Holy Mass Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

First reading: 1 Samuel 3.3b-10, 19 CCC 2578 Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 6.13c-15a, 17-20 CCC 1004, 989, 364.

Your bodies are members of Christ. **Gospel:** John 1.35-42 CCC 608

The disciples of John came and saw where Jesus was staying, and they

remained with him.

In the *first reading*, the sacred author shows that our relationship with God is always one of responding to a vocation, a call from God. God loves us, even as we are; he loves us first; he wills our perfection, the holiness that is real happiness in union with him. In his Gospel, St. John teaches us that Christ first comes to us, that, through others, we are brought closer to Christ, and that our response in faith and love unites us to Christ, the Saviour who is God incarnate. In the *second reading*, St. Paul teaches that, as Christ took our human flesh, our bodies are members of Christ, our flesh is sacred because it has been bought with Christ's own blood. Our human bodies are God's instruments for sanctification of the world. Our bodies are not simply our own, to do with as we would. Chastity is a response born of true mutual love.

Before Mass: The disciples went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they spent the rest of that day with him. (*Lauds*)

After Mass: Andrew met his brother Simon and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah,' and he took him to Jesus. (Vespers)

Ω Dear Parishioners & Friends of Saint Patrick's,

At our meeting in the coming week, the Parish Pastoral Council will continue its discussion with respect to the Parish Mission Statement, a draft of which was submitted in brochure form to parishioners before Christmas. Copies of the Statement remain available at entrances to the church. We have received some helpful and interesting comments with respect to the document. You are certainly invited and encouraged to share your thoughts. You can send your reflections by email, should you wish to do so, to the Parish Office at info@basilica.ca. The Council will explore, among other things, how to encourage the participation of parishioners in the development of the Parish Mission Statement.

As you will be able to note by the presence of scaffolding on the north side (Gloucester) of the church, the plaster restoration project has begun. The estimate of the work is \$105,000 plus GST, on the basis that there are no unforeseen problems - such as repair to the fine artwork. The project is being overseen by members of our Parish Finance Council. The work is projected to last 8 to 10 weeks. We pray for the safety of all those involved in the project.

Last Tuesday, we began Ordinary Time for this liturgical year. During Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the fullness of the mystery of the Lord Jesus Christ. On the first day of the week, the Lord's Day being Sunday, God assembles his beloved people to hear the Word, to reflect upon it, to offer the loving sacrifice of praise of the Mass, and to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord as nourishment for the mission. Then, we are sent forth to proclaim God's love by our words and actions. Following the tradition handed down from Apostolic times, Sunday is the original Christian Feast Day. (Ordo, p. 110)

Next Thursday January 18, we begin the Week of Prayer for Christian This universal week of prayer encourages Christians of all denominations to meet, to participate in liturgies and other community activities, and to pray together. Let us pray that all Christians be one, as desired by Jesus Christ who is the beginning and end of all we believe.


